Workshop Series Outcomes:

In these focused workshops, your district/CMO team will:

- Learn what high-quality math instruction entails,
- Plan to develop a plan for the adoption of standards-aligned, high-quality math materials, and
- Articulate the role of materials adoption and implementation as an adaptive change process centered on equitable student outcomes, with a special focus on Multilingual Learners, with resources and support from English Learners Success Forum (ELSF).

Workshop Series Overview:

Two synchronous sessions (in Orange County, CA). Asynchronous work will need to be completed between sessions, including an onboarding webinar for the first session and an implementation off-boarding webinar.

These focused workshops offer educators the opportunity to learn best practices in choosing and implementing the highest-quality mathematics materials, which includes bringing a variety of stakeholders to the decision table. With that in mind, teams of 4-8 will be recommended for participation, with the majority of the team being classroom teachers.
